## How to Avoid Being Zoombombed

You have probably encountered a Photobomber in your past, right? In today's virtual world, we've seen the evolution of the "Zoombomber," someone who shows up, uninvited, to a Zoom meeting seeking to disrupt and potentially begin sharing unwelcome content.

There are things you can do to secure your Zoom remote learning environment:

\*All settings can be found by visiting nyit.zoom.us, signing in, then clicking **Settings**.

1 Don't post your zoom meeting link publicly.

Share your Zoom meeting link through NYIT's Blackboard Announcements or directly through email, etc.

Consider enabling the setting "Require a password when scheduling new meetings."

This setting will assign a password to your meetings when enabled. If enabled in your default settings, the password will be included in Scheduled Zoom meeting invitations.

Consider disabling the "Join before host" setting.

This setting will prevent students from being able to see, speak, and share content with one another before the instructor joins and officially starts the session.

Consider enabling the "Waiting room" feature.

This setting will prevent any user from joining the session without being individually admitted by the host.

## Waiting room

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Attendees cannot join a meeting until a host admits them individually from the waiting room. If Waiting room is enabled, the option for attendees to join the meeting before the host arrives is automatically disabled. [7]

Consider disabling the ability for All Participants to "Screen Share"

This setting will prevent participants from being able to share their screen. The host can enable a participant's ability to share their screen while the meeting is in session.

Consider using "Lock meeting" once all of your attendees have joined the session.

When a meeting is locked, no new participants can join and the host will not be alerted. Find the "Lock meeting" setting in the Participants window under the "More" button, then click "Lock Meeting."
